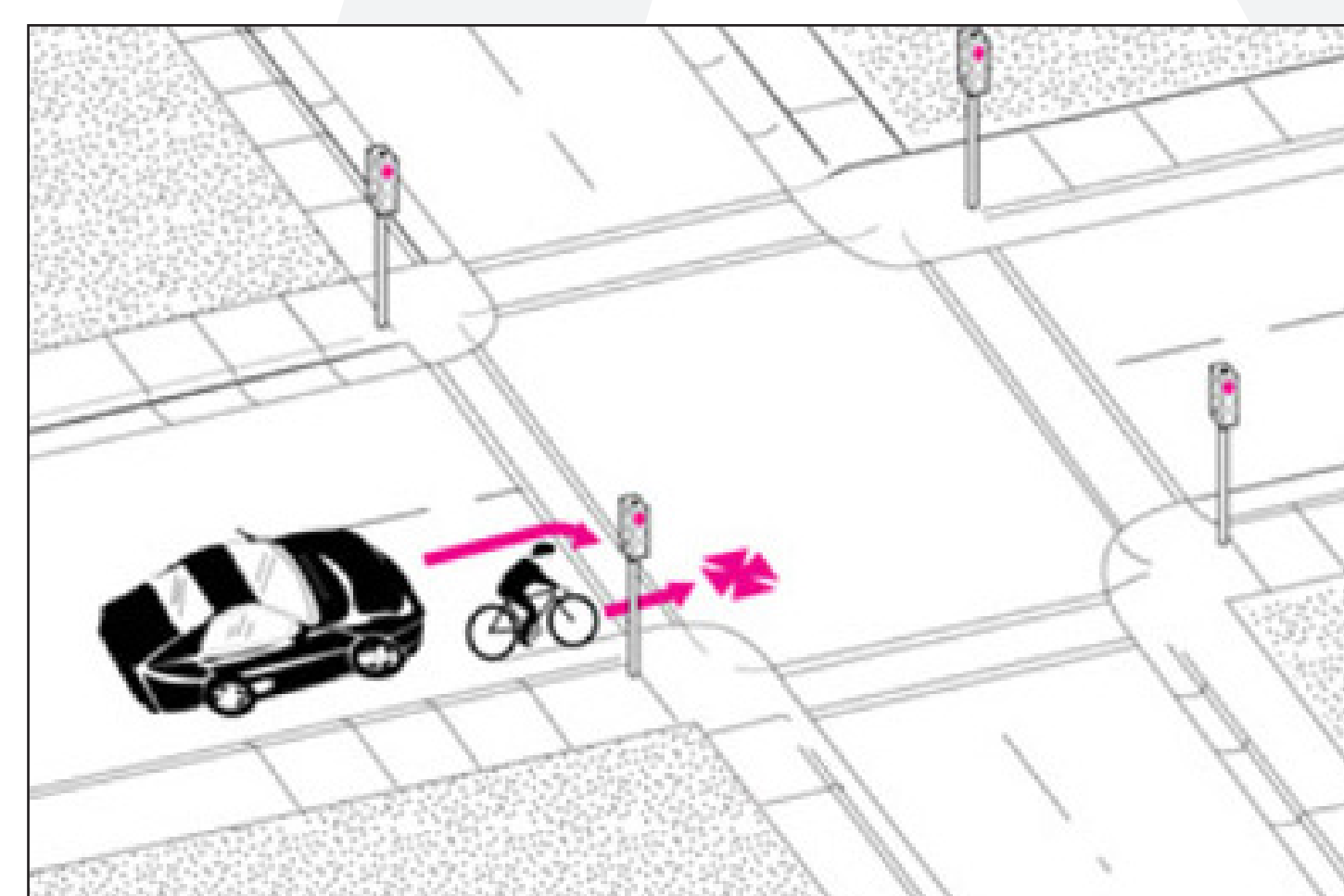
Education

- Teaches bicyclists traffic safety and handling skills, and everyone about rights and responsibilities.



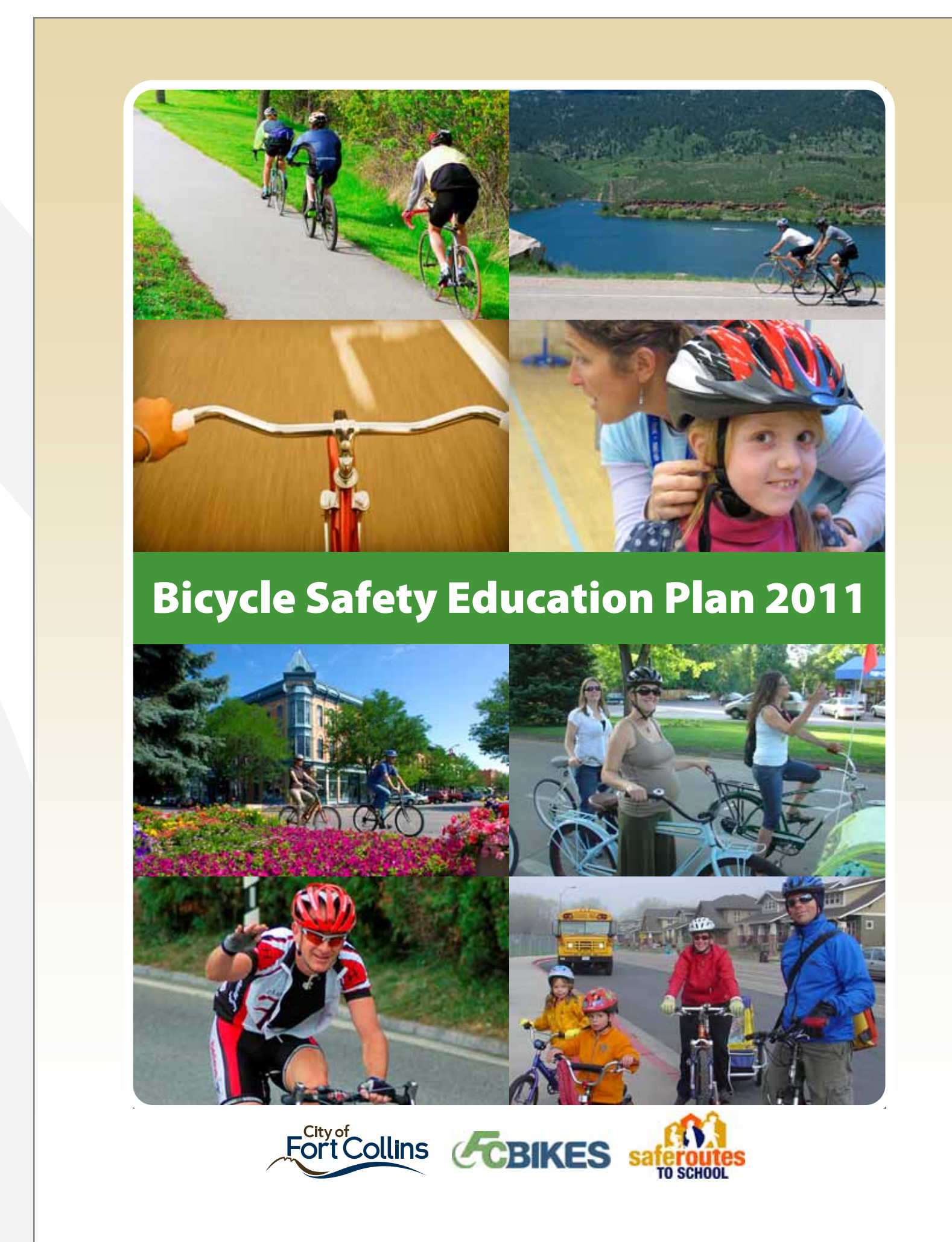
Enforcement
