




Scavenger Hunt by Bike: Explore your City

Instructions: At your own pace, ride your bike to the locations described below. Each clue will direct you to some place specific at each location. Record your answer, and submit your form or answers by May 2. Visit www.fcgov.com/bikespring for submission options. Score 8 points and be eligible to win prizes!

Location	Clue	Answer
<p>1. Ride along the Poudre River Trail and across the new bridge near Lemay Ave that spans the river. Isn't it awesome!</p>	<p>What is the first mile marker to the east along the trail, after the bridge over the river? 1 point</p> <p>BONUS: Out in the open, just west of the mile marker mentioned above, is a very large power poll. What is the number located on the power poll (hint: it's on a yellow sign)? 0.5 point</p>	
<p>2. Laurel Street is home to the city's first protected bike lane, and it intersects with a new roundabout at Remington Street. Give this new project a try!</p>	<p>On Remington, located both north and south of the roundabout, there are wayfinding signs that point to MAX on Mason Street. According to the signs, how many minutes does it take to get to MAX from the roundabout on Remington? 1 point</p> <p>BONUS: What color are the on-street bike racks that separate the bike lane from the traffic lane? 0.5 point</p>	
<p>3. On the Spring Creek Trail, near mile marker 0.75 WEST of College Avenue, you'll find a new sculpture: a tree with bicycle wheels in the "branches".</p>	<p>What is located on the east side of the sculpture's trunk? 1 point</p> <p>BONUS: What is the name of this sculpture? 0.5 point</p>	
<p>4. Prospect can be a challenge to cross if you're headed north or south on bike. The intersection at Heatheridge/Lynwood is an idea of a concept that we are trying to help crossing easier. You can use the push-button signal to make crossing easier!</p>	<p>There is a bus stop located on the north side of this intersection: what is the stop number? 1 point</p>	

<p>5. This image is from the Mason Trail. The wooden post is a pedestrian counter, but there are also bicycle counters located in the concrete. You can tell by their unique shape.</p> 	<p>What are the shapes on concrete that signal the presence of the buried bicycle counter, in line with this wooden post? 1 point</p>	
<p>6. On the Mason Trail near the railroad underpass (and the Troutman MAX station), is one of many encouraging signs along the trail.</p>	<p>Fill in the blank from the sign located just south of the Troutman underpass: "Your _____ warms this trail." 1 point</p>	
<p>7. Another example of an encouraging sign along the Mason Trail can be found at the South Transit Center.</p>	<p>This sign has a heart, but what does it say below? 1 point</p> <p>BONUS: Also located at the South Transit Center is a new Bike n' Ride cage. For a membership fee, you can gain access to secure your bike when using transit. Look inside: how many bikes can fit with the built in racks inside the Bike n' Ride cage? (Assume the loop racks can hold two bikes each, one on each side) 0.5 point</p>	
<p>8. The new wayfinding signs along the Remington Bikeway can help you get from Fossil Creek Park to Old Town and beyond. There's a new sign at Roma Valley Drive near Highcastle Drive.</p>	<p>How many miles to Downtown from here? 1 point</p>
