## **INTEREST OF THE AMICUS CURIAE**

NARO is one of the independent chapters of the National Association of Royalty Owners. The mission of NARO is to encourage and promote the exploration and production of minerals in Colorado while preserving, protecting, advancing, and representing the interests and rights of mineral and royalty owners through education, advocacy, and assistance to its members, to government bodies, and to the public.

NARO represents the interests of oil and gas royalty owners in Colorado, and its members include farmers, ranchers, family trusts, widows, charitable organizations, churches, hospitals, and universities. The average NARO (national) member is over 60-years-old and receives less than \$500 per month of royalty income as a supplement to their social security.

Given that oil and gas production in Colorado is primarily sourced from private lands and that royalties from oil and gas drilling constitute essential income to private landowners who have assigned their rights to drill and produce to an oil and gas operator, the City of Fort Collins' five-year moratorium directly affects NARO's members.

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## DESIRABILITY OF AMICUS CURIAE BRIEF

The *Amicus Curiae* seeks leave to file a brief in support of Plaintiff/Appellee Colorado Oil and Gas Association in order to address the importance of oil and gas development and production to royalty owners. Further, as set forth in the brief filed conditionally herewith, the oil and gas industry brings investment to rural areas where highwage jobs and industry are scarce, and long-term hydraulic fracturing bans such as the one in Fort Collins will severely disrupt the livelihood of individuals living in, and the economies of, those areas. Accordingly, NARO submits that its experience and knowledge will assist the Court in this case.
