Fort Collins, Then and Now

How many of you lived in Fort Collins in 1997?

1997 Fort Collins Population:

~ 105,000

2016 Fort Collins Population:

~ 161,000

Difference

Approximately 1/3rd of the City
was not present for the 1997 City Plan process

Fort Collins, June 26.—The legislative assembly today broke up after a session which was interrupted by a large fire at the Upper Indian Camp.

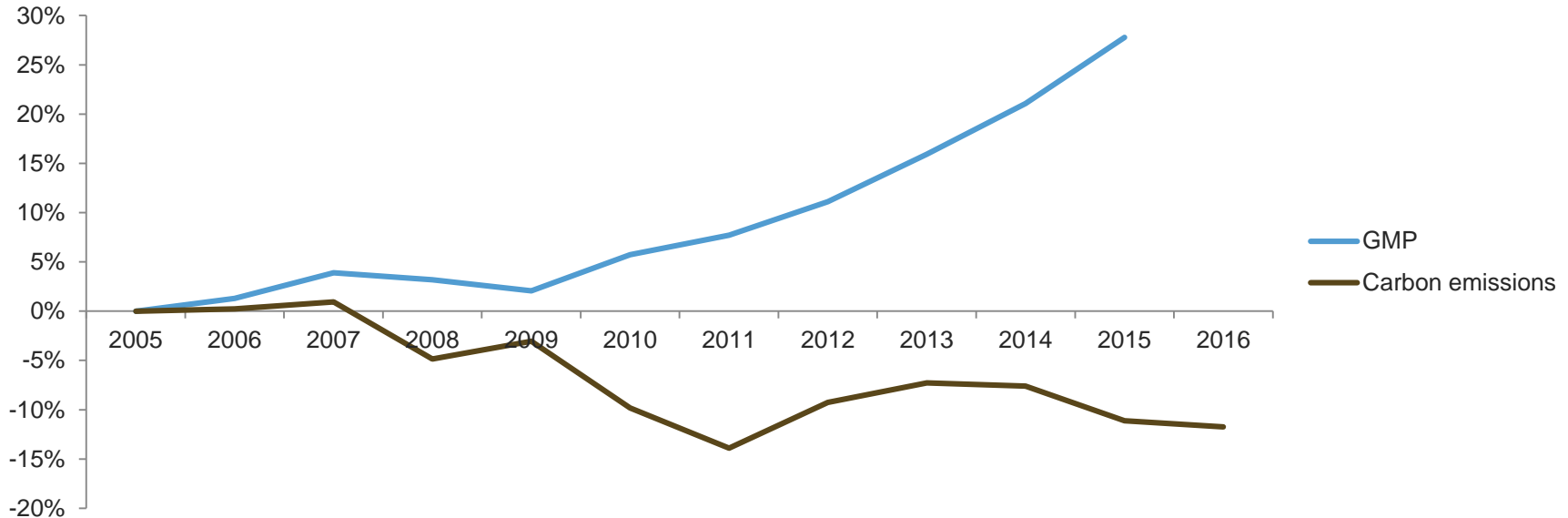
