INCLUSION

Do you need assistance to fully participate in activities listed throughout the Recreator? The City of Fort Collins welcomes individuals of all abilities into our classes and programs. If you are interested in participation support, please indicate any special needs you may have when you register. NOTE: Requests should be made at least two weeks before the class begins.

TRANSITION

If you need more assistance in making your recreation and leisure choices, but want to be as independent as possible, the Transition program might be right for you. Explore new experiences; learn about exciting recreation opportunities and meet new people. A Therapeutic Recreation specialist will help you develop your personal Passport to Recreation Profile and discuss your needs, strengths, and interests. Call 224-6027.
