### **Downed Tree Branch Drop-off Locations**

In response to heavy, wet, spring snow that caused tree damage throughout Fort Collins, the City will set up two drop-off sites where residents can deliver tree limbs and debris at no charge. Traditionally, removing damaged branches is the responsibility of the property owner or tenant; however, due to the increased damage, the City is using emergency reserve funds to provide the community drop-off sites.

From May 22 through June 4, residents can bring downed branches to:

- The City Streets Facility, 625 Ninth Street, (open access 7 days a week) or
- The Hoffman Mill, 1300 Hoffman Mill Rd. (7 a.m. – 5 p.m.; Mon. - Fri.)

“While this storm left several areas with severe tree damage, the damage was not nearly as widespread across the entire city like the 2011 storm,” said City Forester, Tim Buchanan. “Some areas had significant damage, while others had little to none.”

City crews continue working to clear roadways and the public right-of-way. To report a fallen tree limb on public property please call the Forestry Department at 970-221-6660 or through Access Fort Collins [fcgov.com/accessfortcollins](http://fcgov.com/accessfortcollins).

Residents in need of assistance with clean-up on private property or with moving debris should call a local contractor or 2-1-1.
