FEES

Required March 1-Nov. 30
\$5.00 per standard vehicle

\$10.00 per commercial vehicle, bus, motor home, trailer, or van occupied with eight or more passengers.

Annual pass available.

Shelters: Use of picnic shelters are on a first-come, first-served basis, unless reserved. Shelters can be reserved for \$50 each per day. Call 416-2815 or visit fcgov.com/naturalareas for details.

Seaman Reservoir (owned by the City of Greeley) is seen in the distance from the Black Powder Trail.

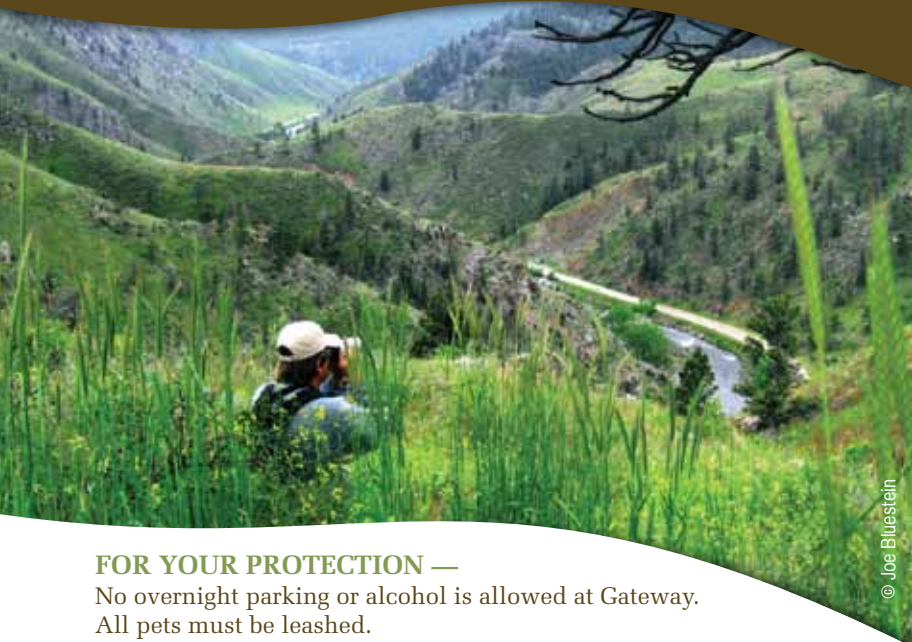
