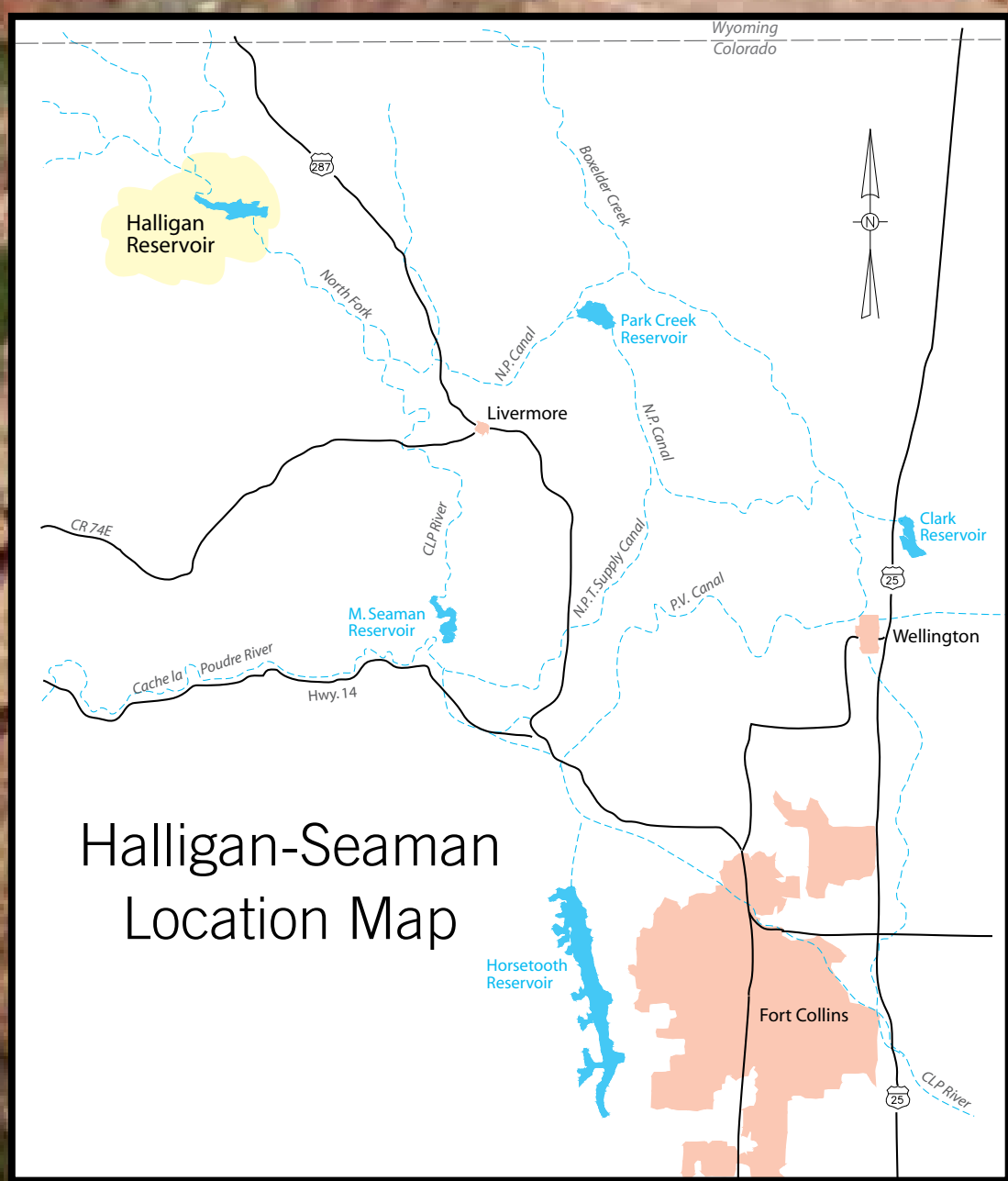
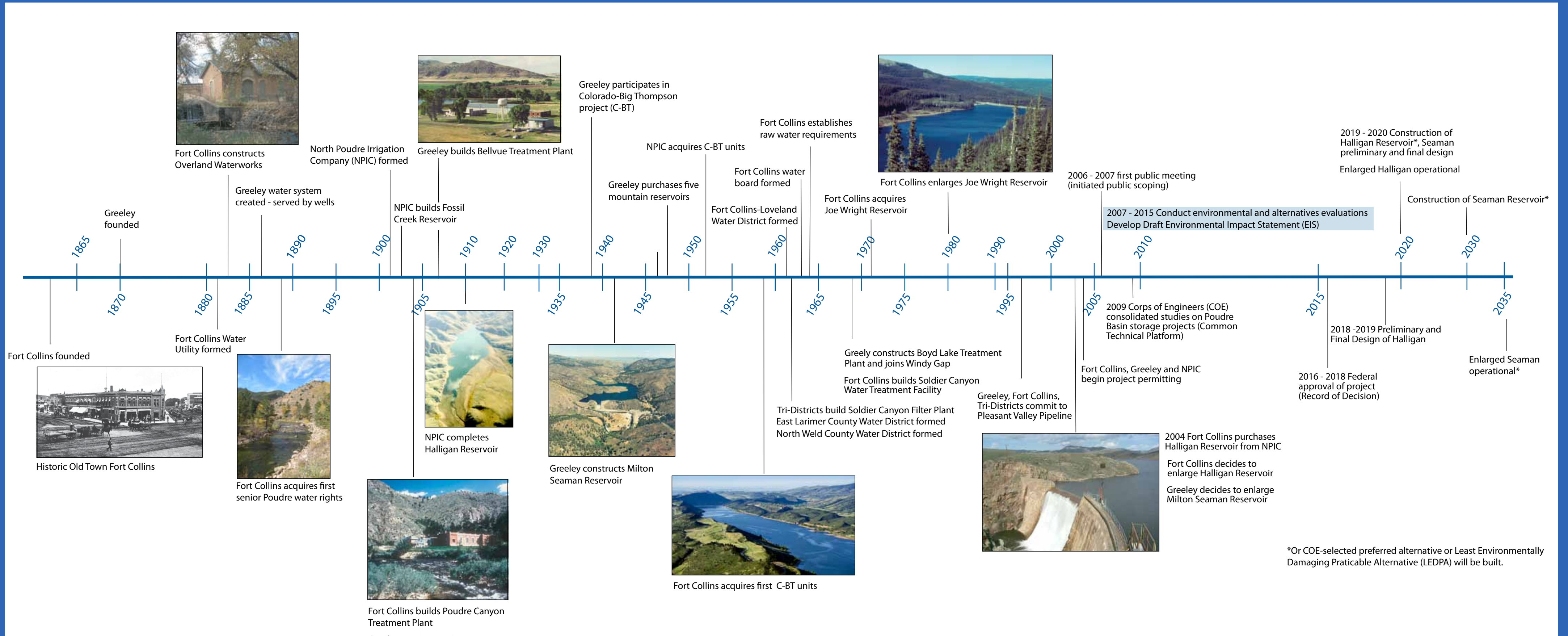


HALLIGAN-SEAMAN Water Management Project



The **Halligan-Seaman Water Management Project** is a regional collaboration among the cities of Fort Collins and Greeley, and North Poudre Irrigation Company (NPIC). The project involves enlargement of two existing reservoirs: Fort Collins' Halligan Reservoir and Greeley's Milton Seaman Reservoir. Careful analysis by the partners determined that expansion of the reservoirs is the most cost effective solution and may have less environmental impact than other options.

More water storage is needed in order to meet the future water needs for Fort Collins, Greeley, and NPIC. Adding storage capacity allows for the collection of water supplies during average and wet years for use later during droughts. This increases the reliability or "yield" of the water system. The added storage, along with coordinated operations between the two reservoirs, will allow better management of existing or newly acquired water supplies in the Poudre River Basin.
