The gardens surrounding the City of Fort Collins Natural Areas Program's offices at Nix Natural Area are beautiful, diverse and hardy because the plants are adapted to our region. Use native plants like these in your own garden and you'll save money, water and maintenance.

Take a stroll among the gardens, each with a different theme. These plants, combined with several water elements, are interesting year-round and provide food, water, cover and shelter to lots of wildlife.



GARDEN THEMES AND TIMELINE

The Natural Areas Program moved to Nix Natural Area in October, 2001. Landscaping and planting began the following year and is still in progress. Most trees and shrubs were planted in 2002. The art piece, "Hidden Habitats" was installed in 2002, and "Prairie Bouquet" in 2006, both by local artist, Joe McGrane.

Fruit Garden - An assemblage of berry-bearing shrubs that birds feast upon. Provides cover for birds, rabbits, snakes and foxes. Planted spring, 2002.

Butterfly Garden - A profusion of flowers provide nectar for adult butterflies and food for caterpillars. Installed and planted 2003.

Fort Collins Garden - Features plants native to Fort Collins. Grasses seeded in 2002; wildflowers in 2004.

Rock Garden - A variety of plants at home among the rocks (*in progress*).

Water Gardens - Trees and shrubs planted in 2007. Water feature is not yet installed. The pond and stream will show the importance of water in a dry climate.

Parking Lot Gardens - They're not boring or high maintenance! Planted 2002.
