DIRECTIONS FROM FORT COLLINS

Take Hwy 1 (Terry Lake Road) to County Road 15 north, towards Waverly. From CR 15, turn north onto Rawhide Flats Road and continue north about 4.5 miles. The bison pasture is on the west side of the road. There are 9 miles of gravel road that can be dusty, rough, and bumpy. Please respect our neighbors and be safe by observing the speed limit.

The Laramie Foothills Bison Conservation Herd is unique because it addresses the three key challenges to bison conservation: disease, genetics, and habitat.


