common prairie plant Roots have been used to make tea and cooked as a vegetable. Most parts have had some medicinal use



fairly tall, showy adapted to pollination by long tongued insects

abundant, white torch-like very poisonous plant; Leaves closely resemble wild onion

## Stemless four nerve daisy

Tetraneuris acaulis (Sunflower family)

native

not stemless, but stems have no leaves

(abundant below Lindenmeir lookout)
