


CITY PARK HISTORICAL TIMELINE

















1907

City purchases 62 acres from John Sheldon

1907

Trolley service from Mountain Avenue to Grand View Cemetery begins

1912

The town Park Commission officially names "City Park"

1913

City purchases Prospect Park, adds acreage to City Park

1919

Public campground opens in City Park

1921

Robert Lampton builds a pavilion, now known as Club Tico

1925

City Park adds diving tower, playgrounds, a warming house and bath house

1940

City Park Nine Golf Course opens

1950

Children's train installed and operated by private concessionaire

1952

A permanent pool is built separate from Sheldon Lake

1958

North ball field updated with a backstop, bleachers and grass

1967

Updates made to the north ball field by upgrading lights

1975

Park maintenance shop opens near City Park Nine Golf Course

1976

Fourth of July celebrated with day-long activities and fireworks

1982

Streets converted to one way inside the park

1988

The 1925 CSU train depot installed for use by the trolley

1999

Improvements made to Sheldon Lake's shoreline

2000

Aeration system is installed in Sheldon Lake

2003

City Park Pool completely renovated

2008

South ball field converted to a regulation sized baseball field.

2012

City Park celebrates 100 years

2016

City begins public outreach to consider improvements to City Park
