Justin reconnected us with the importance of designing buildings to reflect the era in which they are built. In Fort Collins, we love our old buildings from the late 1800's and early 1900's so much that we believed the highest form of flattery when constructing new buildings was to replicate the old. Yet in reality, this approach was diminishing the authenticity of our historic architecture. Justin taught us that the landmarks of the future are created by architects of today who design with materials and technologies of their era, just as the architects of the 1880s, 1900s, and 1920s did to create our most beloved historic buildings.
