Green Energy costs an additional 2.4 cents per kWh, plus PILOTS<sup>1</sup>. Green Energy is sold in blocks of 208 kWh, 417 kWh or 100% of electricity usage for residential customers; and in blocks of 1,042 kWh or 100% of electricity usage for non-residential customers. Customers are asked to sign a twelve-month agreement when signing up. The program requires a 30-day termination process. The product consists of the following new renewable resources averaged annually.
