The Fort Collins Water Treatment Facility (FCWTF) enjoys giving tours to the community and gladly opens its doors once a month for tours. The FCWTF operates 24 hours per day, 365 days per year, and continues treating water even while giving tours. Fort Collins' drinking water comes from the Cache la Poudre River and Horsetooth Reservoir and is treated at the FCWTF.
