Recommendations to Council

- Opt-Out, 4 options
 - Voluntary (anyone can sign up)
 - o Commercial agriculture/beekeepers
 - o Pesticide Sensitive Registry
 - o None
- Zones, 4 options
 - o 1 Zone (whole city)
 - o 3 Zones (tentative statistician recommendation)
 - 4 Zones (tentative statistician recommendation)
 - o 7 Zones (map created by Dr. LeBailly)
- Program Guidelines
 - o Keep as-is
 - Lower vector index (.5)
 - Raise vector index (?)
 - o Change the 'and' to 'or'
 - o Eliminate human cases as an indicator altogether
 - Revise the way thresholds are met through the addition of indicators and a weighting system (long term change, would not happen for the 2014 season)
- Advisory Panel
 - Need additional clarity of roles and expectations
 - o Improve transparency of the process—post Panelists' feedback online
 - Encourage attendance at TAC meetings
 - Allow current and/or former AQAB and NRAB members to serve on the Panel to reduce turnover and de facto term limits
 - Consider having a retired doctor serve as the medical community representative
 - o CSU could change the way weekly data is presented if there are any suggestions
 - Create a succession plan—perhaps have junior members shadow other panel members to learn the process before being responsible for recommendations
 - Expand the panel to have more members
 - Send the TAC a notice through the season when new information is made public
- TAC supports the creation of an IPM coordinator through the BFO process

No further TAC meetings scheduled at this time—will reconvene after the WNV season
