



TRANSFORMER CABINET MURALS

In 2006 the City of Fort Collins, Colorado, Utilities Light & Power Department partnered with the city's Art in Public Places Program to come up with a plan to help mitigate graffiti, reduce maintenance costs on electrical equipment, and add art to the Fort Collins community. The Art in the Alley's project was developed to work with local artists and non-profit groups to paint transformer cabinets with bright, colorful murals of intricate designs to make the cabinets a less attractive surface for graffiti.




