Fort Collins thrives as a hotbed of innovation because of the small-town relationships that carry out big-city ideas. The City supports sector partnerships in health care and manufacturing and industry clusters – geographic concentrations of companies and institutions in a particular field – in software/hardware, bioscience, water innovation and clean energy.

The Rockies Venture Club awarded the City Up and Coming Startup City Award for 2016 as an effort to honor cities that "play a critical part in creating a vibrant startup environment."
