

TOTAL ALLOCATION BY OUTCOME - \$655.6M GENERAL FUND & OTHER FUNDS - 2019






General Fund Revenue

2020 - \$153,594,500







Tax Revenue Detail

2020 - \$117,469,900








Cost of Government


