## American Rescue Plan



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- Other funds available within (ARPA) for:
  - Childcare, utility/water bills, libraries, small business, support for people experiencing homelessness and broadband
- Collaboration with partners and the State vital to leverage all funds available for the community and avoid duplication of funds

\$360B Allocated for Local Government

Additional available funds in housing such as emergency rental assistance, mortgage and utility assistance, National Endowment for the Arts and National Endowment for the Humanities, Low Income Home and Energy Assistance and Water Utility Bill Assistance, Paid Sick Leave Credit and Economic Development Administration.

NOTE: State of Colorado has received ~\$1B in supportive housing; a Planning Grant Program (\$6.8M) for LUC Updates is available

## ARPA State & Local Fiscal Recovery Fund

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Must be related to response and recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic

**\$28.1M allocated to Fort Collins**

City of Fort Collins \$28.1M Total Allocation from ARPA State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund

- Council Approved Ordinance No. 079, 2021 \$4.3M for short-term, immediate needs
  - Development of Fort Collins Recovery Plan
  - Application for these funds available

City Manager's Recommended Budget 2022 ~\$4M for mid-term response and recovery

- Identified opportunities to utilize ARPA funding source
- Recommendation to BLT

Council Approval of Fort Collins Recovery Plan, December 2021 ~\$19M for long-term recovery and resilience

- Remaining funds tied to the recovery plan
- 2023 2024
