

FILTERING PROCESS FOR “THE HOPPER”

Why do we need to filter the measures at all?

The Brendle Group cannot conduct further research on every measure that is put in “the hopper”. The Task Force agreed at the last meeting that the total number of measures needs to be prioritized. No measure will be lost.

How will this prioritization process work?

First, a filtering tool has been created that will list all the suggested measures and some information about the measure. Even measures proposed at the Open House earlier this week would be included. Using this tool, and whatever else the Task Force Member wishes to use to get themselves prepared to make a selection, each Task Force Member will be asked to ***select*** (outside of the meeting and on-line) their **Top Third** measures. No individual ranking by each Task Force member of each measure will be required at this time. Each selection is of equal importance at this stage.

When will this “on-line” voting occur?

The initial selection by Task Force members will occur by noon on ~~Tuesday on July 10th~~ *Monday, July 16*.

What happens next?

Staff will compile the results and bring it to the next meeting of the Task Force on July ~~11th~~ *16th*. At this meeting, the results will be reviewed and the number of selections each measure received will be observed. Using this “groupthink” information, and after much more discussion, the Task Force members will be asked to ***vote*** on a package of measures for further analysis. The package of measures needs to receive a SIMPLE MAJORITY for passage to The Brendle Group for further analysis.

The Task Force will decide what happens to the remaining measures.

When can the Task Force expect to see any analysis from the Brendle Group?

At the August 29th meeting, but the final package of recommendations is not due until December and the selection of measures will require a SUPER MAJORITY so there will be several months of discussions and further exploration.
