



2022 Fort Collins Travel Diary Report

What is the Fort Collins Travel Diary Report?

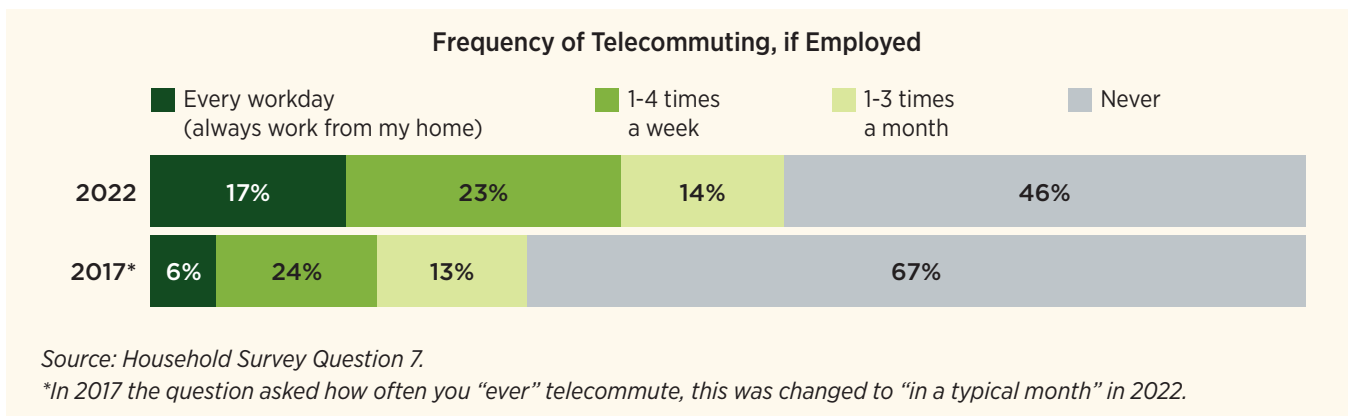
The Fort Collins Travel Diary Report is a summary of the travel survey that is completed every few years to collect data regarding travel behavior for residents. The travel survey is a detailed travel diary that participants fill out over the course of a week, documenting where they go and how (drive, walk, bike, transit, et.) they get there. A total of 7500 potential participants are selected at random and are mailed survey materials to generate a sample size that is statistically significant and representative of the community. The first travel survey was completed in 2017, and the 2022 survey was the second completed by the City.

How has travel behavior changed since 2017?

There has been a variety of changes in travel behavior for residents since 2017. Changes are expected, but in 2020 the COVID-19 pandemic caused an unprecedented shift in the daily lives people around the world, resulting in substantial shifts to travel behavior within Fort Collins.

Key Changes

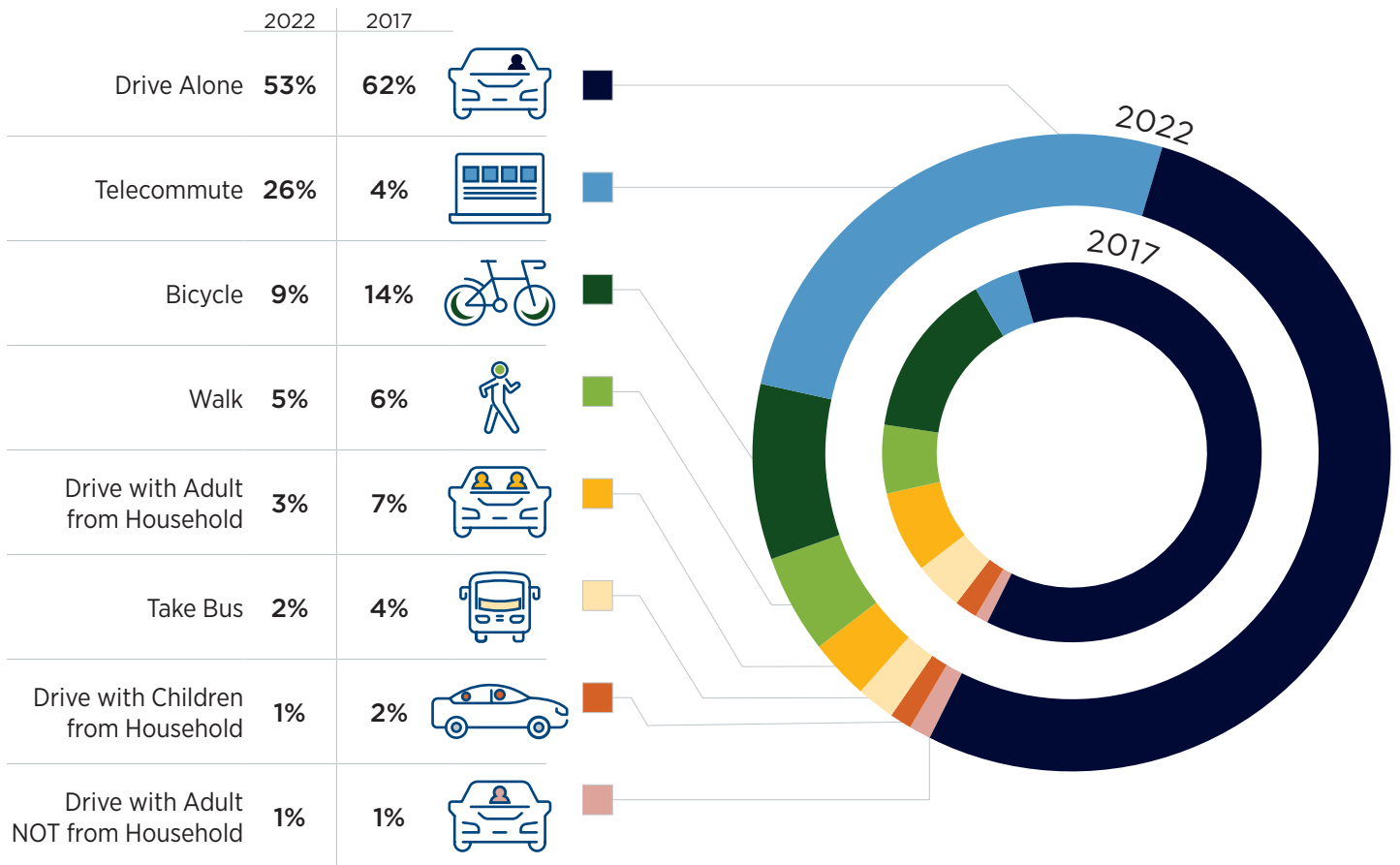
- Telecommuting (remote work, working from home) increased greatly in 2022 due to the impacts of the pandemic.



- Transit usage decreased slightly from 2017 to 2022. Hesitancy to use transit in response to the pandemic as well as decreased levels of service due to driver shortages are believed to be the main factors, despite transit being offered fare-free since 2020.
- Residents rode bicycles more in 2022, but not for getting to work. Commuting by bicycle in 2022 was 36% lower than 2017, likely because of increased telecommuting.
- Single occupancy vehicle trips had the greatest reduction compared to all other modes of travel from 2017 to 2022.
- People walked more in 2022, particularly for casual trips or exercise.
