


# **Transportation Safety**

Transportation safety is always a priority for the City. In 2016, the City of Fort Collins became the first public local entity to join the Colorado Department of Transportation's **Moving Towards Zero Deaths** initiative.

Making progress towards Vision Zero requires a multifaceted, focused effort. It includes collecting, compiling, and analyzing reported traffic crashes to identify crash types, trends, patterns, locations etc. that can lead to mitigation strategies. Safety improvement efforts involve engineering solutions, enforcement efforts, educational outreach, and more.








**Roadway Safety Reminders** 

- Make up more than half of all bike crashes.
- 38% of right-angle crashes involve a cyclist riding against traffic (in road or on sidewalk)

Motorists: look to the right before turning

Cyclists: do not ride against traffic


Protected pedestrian intervals signalized intersections.

### **Approach Turn crashes**



- Are often severe
- 75% of approach turn crashes occur at signalized intersections

Motorists: Do not go if you cannot see!

Motorists: As the light changes, wait to ensure that opposing vehicles are stopping

before crossing roadway
