Vision: We believe that an appreciation of the environment begins with an appreciation of all living things. Every day we teach the young and old alike about the need for conservation, because with knowledge and empowerment we *will* protect the world's natural habitats for generations to come.

Mission: To foster an appreciation of invertebrates while educating the public about the importance of conservation of threatened habitats in the tropics and around the world.

History: Butterfly Pavilion officially opened to the public on July 15, 1995. As the first stand-alone invertebrate facility to receive association of zoos and aquariums accreditation, we are designed to showcase the diversity of these small wonders, their habitats, and the BIG role they play in ensuring the health of our environment. We are home to over living 5,000 invertebrates – animals without backbones - that make up 97% of all animal species on the planet. Over 5.5 million people have visited Butterfly Pavilion.
