This letter provides you with certification that proposed work to your designated Fort Collins landmark property, the McMillen-Patterson Property at 121 N. Grant Avenue has been approved without an application by the City's Historic Preservation Division (HPD) because the proposed work appears to be routine in nature with minimal effects to the historic resource, and meets the requirements of Chapter 14, <u>Article IV</u> of the Fort Collins Municipal Code.

The alterations reviewed include:

• Installation of wood storm door

Notice of the approved application has been provided to building and zoning staff to facilitate the processing of any permits that are needed for the work. Please note that work beyond that indicated in your permit application/correspondence requires additional approval.

If the approved work is not completed prior to the expiration date noted above, you may apply for an extension by contacting staff at least 30 days prior to expiration. Extensions may be granted for up to 12 additional months, based on a satisfactory staff review of the extension request.




Proposed design with new storm door


The house as it was advertised and later built was featured in the 1881 edition of William Comstock's Victorian Domestic Architectural Plans and Details, " Plate 73.

A reduced scale version of these plans was built by Herman Schroeder in 1887.


We only have one door where this drawing has two. Still, I want the design to match.

Quick sketch on graph paper has one full panel above to combine original design window and 6 below. with single door dimensions.


We have located a match to the original screen hinge which we are in the process of refurbishing.
