This letter provides you with certification that proposed work to your designated Fort Collins landmark property, the Colorado & Southern Depot and Docks at 250 N. Mason St. has been approved by the City's Historic Preservation Division (HPD) because the proposed work appears to be routine in nature with minimal effects to the historic resource, and meets the requirements of Chapter 14, <u>Article IV</u> of the Fort Collins Municipal Code.

The alterations reviewed include:

• Doorbell installation for northeast door on non-historic metal door/window frame

Notice of the approved application has been provided to building and zoning staff to facilitate the processing of any permits that are needed for the work. Please note that work beyond that indicated in your permit application/correspondence requires additional approval.

If the approved work is not completed prior to the expiration date noted above, you may apply for an extension by contacting staff at least 30 days prior to expiration. Extensions may be granted for up to 12 additional months, based on a satisfactory staff review of the extension request.

Melanie,

Thanks for checking in – that's a pretty automatic approval on our end since that metal entry on the northeast is not historic material. Our primary concern with doorbells, signs, light fixtures, etc., on historic masonry buildings is to put anchor screws/bolts into the mortar joints instead of brick faces, which doesn't seem to apply here. I think you're fine in this case but if you'd prefer to have a Certificate of Appropriateness to cover any Municipal Code 14 concerns, please let us know and we'll get that issued (I've copied our general inbox so you get a faster response). Cheers!
