Dear Property Owner:

This letter provides you with certification that proposed work to your designated Fort Collins landmark property, the Reed-Dauth Block at 223 Linden St., has been approved by the City's Historic Preservation Division (HPD) because the proposed work appears to be routine in nature with minimal effects to the historic resource, and meets the requirements of Chapter 14, <u>Article IV</u> of the Fort Collins Municipal Code.

The alterations reviewed include:

- Painting Repainting brick arches in Sherwin-Williams 7016 Mindful Gray; repainting existing black columns and wood window trim in Sherwin-Williams 7020 Black Fox
 - Conditions: Any necessary paint removal shall be done in the gentlest means possible to avoid damage to existing materials (e.g., no sandblasting). Paint applied to the brick arches shall be of a highly vapor permeable type to allow moisture to pass through the bricks. Please be advised to either test the existing paint to determine if it is oil-based or apply an oil-based primer before painting to prevent bubbling/peeling.

Please note that work beyond that indicated in your permit application/correspondence requires additional approval. Items requiring further approval include, but are not limited to, the following activities:

• Any additional painting, such as the main body of the building or other trim/brackets not within the present scope

If the approved work is not completed prior to the expiration date noted above, you may apply for an extension by contacting staff at least 30 days prior to expiration. Extensions may be granted for up to 12 additional months, based on a satisfactory staff review of the extension request.

Hi Dustin,

Thanks for reaching out about this – Painting is something that requires a Certificate of Appropriateness, so I can help with that once the plan is set!

The guidance we generally provide related to color selection is that colors should accentuate rather than obscure architectural features – Painting everything black would not work, for instance, because it would make the different architectural features hard to make out. If the owner would like to do grays and blacks, painting the existing blue wood features black and the tan wood features a contrasting lighter gray would work!

I'd advise you to either test to make sure the paint is not oil-based or to use an oil-based primer followed by either an oil-based or latex-based paint because latex/water-based paints will bubble and peel if applied directly to oil-based paint, and also any needed paint removal should be done in

the gentlest means possible to avoid material damage (e.g., no sandblasting, please!). We will make sure to have our painter check this if approved to proceed, and WILL NOT do any sandblasting.

We also do not allow the painting of unpainted masonry – But the main body of this building is also already painted, as are the brick arches (but not the stone accents), correct? Yes, I believe this is correct also. Is repainting the brick within the scope of the project? It's certainly possible, but not guaranteed at this point. If so, you'll want to make sure the paint type has a high vapor permeability – Paint can trap moisture in bricks, and when that moisture undergoes freeze-thaw cycles, the brick faces can actually crumble or fall off.

When you/the owner would like to move forward with this project, to make up the COA, I just need a list of paint color names and paint types (or links to them) and photos of each side of the building to have any elements painted with those photos marked up to show where the different paints will be used.
