  - Gathered information from Housing Catalyst about their good neighbor protocols related to permanent supportive housing (PSH)

  - Need to be considerate of residents, businesses and other factors unique to each surrounding area

# 11:40 - 12:20 Impacts & Opportunities and Mitigation & Engagement

- Consider impacts and opportunities by location and for different groups
  - Opportunity to add other amenities at N. College site due to size is this applicable to the Vine & Redwood site?
    - Site on Vine is larger than N. College site so additional amenities could also be added there
    - Downtown Development Authority owns property next to Vine site and was recently remapped by FEMA
  - Cost of land higher in Midtown than E. Mulberry corridor
  - People experiencing homelessness need to give feedback to these considerations as well
    - Feedback so far has been more about services being co-located than location-specific input
- Consider overall mitigation strategies and site-specific strategies
  - This facility will offer 24/7 shelter for the first time, that in itself may mitigate some impacts
    - North Fort Collins Business Association Survey shows some daytime activities that would decrease if there were better/more day options for shelter
    - Catholic Charities ran day shelter prior to the pandemic main benefit was relief of pressure on law enforcement, businesses, etc.
    - Denver Catholic Charities site operates 24/7 and offers transportation to get people between sites, employment opportunities, resources and

other services

- Some behavioral issues arise from stress due to constant moving between sites, nowhere to store belongings, etc. and having one consistent place to access services could reduce that
- Can't solve homelessness issue by building a shelter it's one part of a comprehensive, systematic effort to reduce homelessness and housing instability
- Northside Aztlan as temporary emergency shelter during beginning of pandemic is an interesting example some successes and some challenges
  - Saw influx of people come from outside community
  - Would not have succeeded long-term
  - This site received accolades for its success in responding to COVID quickly and efficiently
- Some of the more progressive communities offering a litany of services for people experiencing homelessness have rampant issues with camping and other impacts
  - What are our boundaries as a healthy community?
- Continuum of Care's efforts acknowledge the need for systems approach
- How do we pay attention to lessons learned?
  - Murphy Center was started as a resource center and has evolved into more of a day shelter - no other space has met this need
