• Would the committee like to consider adding or removing any locations from consideration?

1) Should we add Vine & Redwood to the conversation?

Location - Vine & Redwood

- A Larimer County property (is in a flood plain) currently a fleet shop to the North of Traffic Operations for the City
- Main building has been condemned for years will know more in the next 6 9 months about when the decision will be made
- Acreage of the County fleet services site is a little under 8 acres
- Convenient to being in between current service providers
- Consider because storm water could be mitigated central location close to upper N. Ft Collins
 & other services in the area could partner with Larimer County
- Several members expressed the question Wondering why we wouldn't consider this?
- Decision has not been made by County as to what to do to the property if it's not going to be re-developed it would be put up for sale once decision to sell wouldn't be part of the County

Commitment from members to consider Vine & Redwood location - everybody committed, mostly agreeing - will leave this on the spreadsheet

2) Are there any options on this list that are nonviable that could be removed to focus on a fewer number in greater depth?

Location: Viability of Behavioral Health

- Trilby & Taft near the landfill - - others agree this location is too far out from other services.

Commitment from members to remove Behavioral Health Services Facility from further investigation - Everybody committed - take off the list

Q: What are Pros and Cons of co-located services?

- Intentional effort to increase outreach in different segments of community and down in Loveland trying to reach people in different locations
- Big benefit of having services close together is PEH don't have to go back and forth to get services basics include: where to go during day, where to go during night, where you get fed if these are close together creates less work for those trying to get out of homelessness
- Transportation is difficult even with adequate public transportation

Location: Mulberry & I-25

- Feels like an area that the County & City having challenges with in general feels like a dangerous mix drug activity, trafficking activity
- Creating a "off-the-highway" stop for attracting those needing services
- Clarification from Clay goes from Lemay & Mulberry all the way out to I-25 a broader area for consideration

- Large police presence makes it a good area(?) a lot of drug activity make it easier to
 access drugs and could impact our travelers, tourists, having more homeless people in
 our motels and hotels
- One motion to keep it on the table good transportation and opportunities closer to
 Lemay an area that would have less impact on neighborhoods
- Annexation timing unclear going through process where we're looking at service implications - could start as soon as a year and a half - realistically like 2 years - probably in medium-term - unsure of what parts we would start with

Q: Is Annexation a necessity to move the project forward if Mulberry corridor is chosen?

- County has a land-use entitlement that could allow for development of a site in this location
- An impact, but may not prevent using this as a site

Commitment to keep Mulberry (Lemay-Timberline) location for exploration - even distribution - let's leave it on for consideration

Q: What evidence is there of this or what supports the notion that underserved groups must be separated geographically in order to be effectively served?

- Murphy Center hub of services definitely populations that don't come, Spanish speakers who are homeless don't come with the same frequency as other demographics, don't serve as many youth as we know are in our community - local evidence is limited demographic that come to Murphy Center on day-to-day basis
- Dry vs. wet distinction?
- Different marginalized groups, Latinx, BIPOC that they can't co-exist?
 - Poudre Valley Mobile Home Park concern about getting into the park at night

Q: How do we capture a sense of urgency in this spreadsheet? Can we include what the process steps that still need to happen for each piece of property - planning, zoning, development - as compared to need in the community?

- Add another column timeline for development
- Consider property acquisition if someone doesn't already own the property this will change depending on location and adds a level of complexity

Q: How long does it take to make changes / start the project from when the property is acquired?

- If you have the property, can take up to a year to get ready

What's not working and/or working in today's meeting from the Member's perspective?

- Mitigating factors may have more robust conversation
- Providers want services close for their guests, and business owners / neighborhoods would rather not may be at a stuck point

- North Fort Collins Business Association put out a survey to collect data on potential inputs
- Examples from other communities could provide information about facilities in Denver
- A lot of work and unknowns and we can strive to get a recommendation not just lots of options something we can say, "this is our first option"
- Once we have the mitigation and strategies filled out, and have talked to funding considerations
 what's the least-worst choice
- Challenge is that we're provider heavy can sway the vote not an equally weighted representation of the community - hoping for commitment about what's least impactful for the community AND serves PEH
- Can we start with something rather than creating a mitigation plan in the meeting?
 - Need better tools to "categorize/grade" the options
- A day-shelter makes a big difference people don't want to be sleeping in ditches, roaming around, just don't have anywhere else to go if we have effective day-shelter can do better outreach and move people through and out of the situations that they are in
 - location wasn't big enough + exacerbated by the Pandemic
 - Influences case manager's ability to maintain contact with guests felt every day at the Murphy Center
- Really important for Point A & Point B to be closer when people are seeking services may be the main factor to getting people out of homeless shelter
- What information and resources would the committee like to have to inform considerations and recommendations?
 - Feedback from North Fort Collins Business Association
 - Crime Statistics don't want to just focus on negative impacts
