



Skills Based Volunteer

Volunteer Description Overview

Skills Based Volunteers help complete professional-level projects for diverse Natural Areas staff. Current projects are listed at:

Each volunteer is assigned a main staff contact who oversees the technical side of the project. In the spring, Skills Based Volunteers work independently with assistance from the staff contact who requested help with the project. In the fall, a cohort of Skills Based Volunteers will meet monthly (5-6:30 p.m., the first Wednesday of every month) to learn more about the Natural Areas Department and receive support from the Public Engagement team, in addition to working with their staff contact. Key Responsibilities

- Work effectively with Natural Areas staff to complete a project and achieve stated priorities of the position.
- Meet regularly with staff to check in on stated expectations defined in a project plan (either in person, phone, or email).
- Attend all four cohort sessions.
- Give a 10-minute presentation about your project's results.
- Record hours and impact through the City's online system, Engage.

Impact

Help a high functioning staff and volunteer team steward our natural areas by completing a professional, high-impact project.

- Job-specific training from your appointed staff contact
- FC Volunteers online onboarding course
- Natural Areas Department's orientation
- Opportunity to attend continuing education sessions
