## Respect the WILDLIFE

### AVOID GETTING TOO CLOSE

How close is too close?

- Wild creatures have different flight distances.



- Learning about the animal will help you judge.


# Respect the WILDLIFE

YOU ARE TOO CLOSE if you see the following animal behaviors

- runs, flies, hops, etc. AWAY or runs

AT you,

- appears nervous, stops what it was doing,
- keeps looking at you,
- gives distress call, stamps feet, drags wing,  
plays dead or other displays.



*Motto: Observe animals from the distance THEY feel safe, not from where YOU feel safe.*

## Respect the WILDLIFE



- Make your observations brief.
- Don't chase an animal or harass it.
- Move quietly, slowly, and in plain view.

Respect #6

## Respect the WILDLIFE



- Use a blind, if available.
- Use imitation devices sparingly.
- Divide large groups into small ones.

## Respect the ENVIRONMENT

- Some “harmless” behavior causes harm later.
- Tread softly. Damage affects all species.
- Do not disturb flowers, seeds or vegetation.
- Leave no litter.

# Respect the ENVIRONMENT

## DON'T ALTER THE ENVIRONMENT BY FEEDING THE ANIMALS

- Artificial food supply equals population boom.
- Wildlife lose their fear of humans.
- You may lure in “pests.”
- Feeding wildlife is illegal in many areas.



# Respect the ENVIRONMENT

- Do not collect in parks, refuges and designated wilderness areas.

- Collecting is okay on private land if you have permission.

- Scientists now concentrate on wildlife behavior, rather than collecting.

- We recommend taking memories, not specimens.



# Respect the ENVIRONMENT

It is illegal for you to collect...

- endangered species,
- feathers from songbirds or raptors, and
- anything from archeological sites.



# Respect your NEIGHBORS

- Respect your fellow viewers.
- Respect private property.
- Respect the right of way.
