#### Wildlife ID

- You don't have to identify wildlife in order to enjoy them
- But being able to identify what you see can be fun and interesting, like solving a mystery



# Ways to Identify the Wildlife You See

- Ask somebody nearby who is more experienced with the area
- Go to a zoo or natural history museum and search for what you saw
- Go to a place where certain animals are known to be and try to identify them
- Look up the animal in habitat guides or field guides



# Birds For Example - What Are The Important Clues?

- Shape and size
- Color(s), markings
- Location
- Behavior
- Song or call









## **Investigating Wildlife Evidence:**Who Dunnit?

- Wildlife leave signs of their presence, even when you don't see the animal itself
- Examples of signs include:
  - Tracks
  - Scats
  - Food leftovers
  - Feathers
  - Fur
  - Discarded skin


