Fort Collins tax initiatives funded land acquisitions along the foothills and Poudre River.




Citizen-initiated ballot measure created the *Natural Areas Program* and funded conservation and stewardship for five years.



Revenues were distributed to the municipalities based on population. This supported Fort Collins Natural Areas operations and maintenance until 2003.























Natural areas and trails funding was extended through 2005 with the *Building Community Choices* tax measure in Fort Collins.


















Larimer County citizens extend funding for open space and natural areas until 2018.




















The tax focuses on conservation of lands locally, regionally, and within community separators.












To date the Natural Areas Department has conserved 42,000 acres and actively manages 35,000 acres of natural areas.








































Cottonwood Hollow Natural Area Opened in 2000
