WHAT DOES AN "ADOPTER" DO?

Adopters....

Make A One-Year Commitment:

You will be asked to make a one-year commitment. After that you may renew, change or discontinue your agreement.

Visit Their Natural Area Each Month:

You will be encouraged to visit your natural area every month. This is a neat opportunity to see the area change though the seasons.

Pick Up Litter:

Natural Areas staff will provide you with an official Adopter vest, a map of your site and trash bags. You will monitor your site for litter and commit to keeping it clean on a regular basis.

Keep A Record:

You will send a report of your visits to the Natural Areas Department Volunteer Coordinator who will record your hours and deal with any maintenance concerns.
