White locoweed

Oxytropis sericea
(Pea family) native
Beautiful showy
flowers in clumps.
Can be toxic to
livestock, especially
horses. Leaves
mostly at base,
divided into very
hairy leaflets



Shaggy daisy

Erigeron pumilus (Sunflower family) native Common in dry grassland early in year. Foliage has fine fuzzy hairs.



Textle onion

Allium textile
(Onion family) native
Common in early summer
Bulb has a fibrous covering.
Strong onion smell unlike
plant to right whose foliage
looks very similar.

Foothills death camas

Zigadenus paniculatus (False-Hellebore family) native. Single torch-like flower heads scattered across the dry prairie. **Poisonous** but beautiful.







Lambert's locoweed

Oxytropis lambertii (Pea family) native. This looks a great deal like the white locoweed on the front, but a different color

Missouri milkvetch

Astragalus missouriensis
(Pea family) native
Common Plains species. Several species
of Astragalus grow here and they are
difficult to tell apart without seed pods.





Bladderpod

Physaria (Lesquerella) spp. (Mustard family) native. Look for 4 petal flowers and globular seed pods on stalks.
