Neighborhood Services offers free mediation to those within the city limits.

### The answer is C. You could be charged \$3000. Although, if cooperative, it is rare for more than one person to receive a ticket.

# It is illegal to have a keg party in Fort Collins



## False.

It is legal to have a keg party, however if you are selling cups you must first obtain a liquor license. If your party is out of control and you need help, you can call the police non-emergency number and if you are the first person to call on your party (before a neighbor) you are less likely to receive a ticket.

### **True or False?**

The answer is True. However you must call before there have been any other complaints. You can ask dispatch if you are the first person to call in on the party. If they tell you a neighbor has already called then clear your party immediately.

On your first noise violation ticket you will probably have to attend a class.

#### True or False?

The answer is True. Students attend a "Party Partners" class and non-students attend a similar class taught by City police officers.
