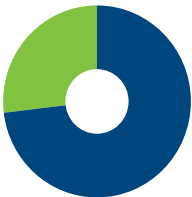

2021 RECREATION HIGHLIGHTS

- The Child Care Relief Grant provided scholarships for qualifying low-income families, allowing nearly 100 children to participate in accessible, no-cost summer camp programs.
- Youth programs enrolled over 900 children in 3,000 programs and activities throughout the summer.
- Recreation partnered with Salud Health Clinic to host several COVID-19 vaccine clinics at facilities throughout the year. More than 8,000 COVID-19 vaccines were distributed to community members.

2021 PARKS HIGHLIGHTS

- March snowstorm response resulted in 3,100 trees pruned, 300 trees removed, and over 35,000 cubic yards of branches and logs recycled.
- Twin Silo's harvest produced a 103-pound donation to the Larimer Country Food Bank and over 70 pounds of hops for Odell Brewing Company.
- Urban Forest Ambassador volunteer program kicked off in September 2021. Volunteers updated over 700 trees in the public tree inventory.

2021 PARK PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTS

- Traverse Park, located in northeast Fort Collins, opened in November. Park highlights include: pump track, activity spine, and an Art in Public Places piece, "Neighborhood Hammock" created by Joe McGrane.
- Upgrades to the downtown Oak Street Plaza were completed in June 2021, including repairs and replacement of the fountain feature and improvements to the pedestrian walking area.
- A new four-season restroom facility was built in City Park. The new facility features include upgraded amenities, ADA compliant restroom access, wraparound porch with trellis, and an Art in Public Places sculpture which mimics snowberry shrubs and flowers.

2021 PARK PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTS (CONTINUED)

- Completed one mile of paved trail between Lincoln Middle School/Lancer Drive and the Poudre Trail
- Created by artist Frank Garza, “The Hand that Feeds” sculpture was unveiled in October at Sugar Beet Park. The sculpture and plaza where it is located was made possible by private donations, as well as contributions from Park Planning & Development and Art in Public Places. Honoring the heritage of Hispanic and Mexican sugar beet workers, the sculpture serves to recognize their memorable impacts made in the history of Fort Collins and the surrounding areas.
