

The largest natural area in the Fossil Creek corridor, this 1,438-acre site provides critical migratory and wintering habitat for numerous bird species. A 1/4-mile buffer around the 810-acre reservoir was established to help protect over 200 species of wildlife known to use this natural area. Bald eagles, great blue herons, great egrets, and cormorants

nest in shoreline trees.

## 10-Year Site Management Objectives

- Protect high wildlife use of the site.
- \*Expand grassland restoration efforts.
- \*Enhance wetland and shoreline vegetation.
- Improve trail system.
