Data collection tools changed in September 2020 with CRISP (Combined Regional Information Systems Project) activation. This contributed to the shift in total call numbers. Despite this difference, the ratio of citizen and officer-initiated calls has remained consistent.

Average 4:28 Response Time

Priority 1 calls are the emergency, life-and-death situations that require an immediate response from first responders. In 2022, our goal was **5 minutes**, **15 seconds** or less from the time dispatch received the call until an officer arrived on scene.

FORT COLLINS POLICE ACADEMY

Since the first class of cadets graduated in 2021, our academy continues to allow FCPS to train recruits from day one on the skills, mindset, and values required to be an officer. In 2022, **two academy classes** were held with a total of **18 graduates**. We received **490 applications** for those hiring processes.





REGIONAL TRAINING CENTER

The Northern Colorado Law Enforcement Center officially opened on March 5, 2021 and continues to serve as a valuable resource for Fort Collins Police Services, Loveland Police Department, and other regional law enforcement agencies to continuously **advance their skills** and **support the safety of our Colorado communities**.

AGENCY ACCREDITATIONS



Fort Collins Police Services earned **CALEA** accreditation in 2019. Following initial accreditation, ongoing work is required to maintain certification. FCPS successfully completed our first four annual reviews, including one in 2022. Our next onsite review will be conducted in March 2023.



The agency also earned accreditation through the **Colorado Association of Chiefs of Police** in 2014. We were reaccredited in 2019, and will complete another review in 2024.



FC911 continues to maintain its status as an Accredited Center of Excellence through the **International Academies of Emergency Dispatch**. In 2022, FC911 triaged and provided EMD (Emergency Medical Dispatching) on 14,215 calls for service with the monthly average of 1,185 EMD calls.

MAJOR CASE INVESTIGATIONS

The Criminal Investigations Division (CID) is home to our specialized detective units: Crimes Against Persons Unit, Criminal Impact Unit, Forensic Services Unit, Northern Colorado Drug Task Force, Property Crimes Unit and the newly formed Cyber Crimes Unit (previously the Financial Crimes and General Investigations Units). Formation of the Cyber Crimes Unit will streamline and enhace expertise in online investigations. Crimes investigated by the unit include fraud, cryptocurrency, online sexual exploitation, and internet luring of children.

CID's case count increased **3.2%** in 2022, after **14.9%** and **10.9%** increases for 2021 and 2020, respectively. **Fraud** is the number one case type investigated this year by FCPS detectives, with sexual assault on a child being the second.
