Get Support	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Call: 970-494-4200 x4• Walk-in: 1217 Riverside Ave in Fort Collins
Services Provided	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mobile crisis support, phone support, walk-in, or clinician meeting person where they're at. Mental health support resources. Crisis stabilization unit.
Availability	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Call: 24/7/365• Walk-in: 8am-Midnight

SummitStone Police Co-Responders

When to Call	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Police are needed to maintain safety• The person may or may not be open to assistance or aware that help has been called
Get Support	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Call 911 in Larimer County or the city of Loveland
Services Provided	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Mental health professionals arrive on scene with law enforcement to provide crisis stabilization
Availability	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Larimer County Sheriff: 7 days/week, 10am-8pm• Loveland Police: 7 days/week, 9am-7:30pm• Estes Park Police: Weds-Fri & alternating weekends, noon-10pm

Mental Health Response Team

When to Call	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• First responders are needed for medical and/or safety concerns• The person may or may not be open to assistance or aware that help has been called• The person needs a mental health and/or basic medical assessment
Get Support	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Call Fort Collins Police to request MHRT (970-419-FCPD)
Services Provided	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Crisis stabilization where the person is located.• Basic mental health assessment to determine safety, risk, and need• Basic medical assessment to determine if other care is needed• Ongoing support until the person is stable and connected to services
Availability	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Currently Fort Collins only• 7 days/week, daytime hours• This team responds with police, fire, and EMS
