## For the Curbside Recycle Bin


#### WRAPPING PAPER

Reuse wrapping paper or recycle in your curbside bin, or in the mixed paper bin at the City's Timberline Recycling Center. **Do not include metallic wrapping** 


paper, ribbons, or bows.

#### **TISSUE PAPER**

Reuse tissue paper or recycle in your curbside bin, or in the mixed paper bin at the City's Timberline Recycling Center. **Do not include glitter, metallic items, any ribbons, or bows.** 



Recycle cardboard in your curbside bin, or at the City's Timberline Recycling Center. **Disposing of cardboard in the trash is illegal in Fort Collins.** 





Recycle trees from Dec. 26 through Jan. 20. Please remove all lights, string, wire, metal hooks, nails, ornaments, tinsel, fake snow, and bags before dropping off at these locations.

- **Edora Park**, 1420 E. Stuart St. (tennis court parking lot)
- Rolland Moore Park, 2201 S. Shields St. (southeast corner of parking lot)
- City Streets Facility, 625 Ninth St. (southwest corner of Vine and Lemay)
- Fossil Creek Park, 5821 S. Lemay Ave. (enter on Lemay Ave.)
- Larimer County Landfill, 5887 S. Taft Hill Rd.
- Wellington Recycling Drop-off, Town Garage (corner of 6th and Grant)

## **Recycle Elsewhere**

DO NOT PUT IN CURBSIDE BIN

#### BATTERIES



Drop off batteries to the Hard-to-Recycle Materials Yard at the City's Timberline Recycling Center or at Larimer County's Household Hazardous Waste Facility. **Dg not place in curbside recycle bin.** 

#### **HOLIDAY LIGHTS & EXTENSION CORDS**

Recycle strings of lights and extension cords at scrap metal recyclers. See *fcgov.com/a-z* for details.

#### PLASTIC BAGS

Recycle clean, dry, empty, plastic bags at grocery stores, specific retail stores, and at the City's Timberline Recycling Center. For complete details, see *fcgov.com/a-z*.

#### STYROFOAM & PACKING PEANUTS

Can be reused or thrown in the trash.

#### ELECTRONICS

Disposing of electronics in the trash or in your curbside recycle bin is illegal in Colorado due to the toxicity of their components. Find out where to safely dispose of household electronics at *fcgov.com/a-z*.

#### COOKING OIL

For a \$5 entry fee, you can drop off used cooking oil in a clear, sealed container at the City's Timberline Recycling Center Hard-to-Recycle Materials Yard. **Do not put fats, oils, and grease down the drain.**
