Nearly 4,700 residents have an ambulatory disability, the majority of whom are seniors.

21% of all homeowners in Fort Collins cannot afford their monthly housing costs.

Nearly 950 affordable rentals were built in the community since 2012.

More than 1,000 PSD students experienced homelessness throughout the '17 - '18 school year.

Fort Collins has a relatively low poverty rate for a community with a large university presence.

Lack of access to healthy food disproportionately impacts Hispanic households in Fort Collins.

Veterans comprise 13% of persons experiencing homelessness in Fort Collins.

Nicotine use by local youth is reported at 32%, largely driven by e-cigarettes.

The City is developing a framework to benchmark diversity and equity indicators in the community.
