



## ***City Allocates Federal Funds for Affordable Housing and Community Development***

On Tuesday, June 7, 2005 the Fort Collins City Council formally adopted the Fiscal Year 2005-2006 Funding Allocation for community development and affordable housing proposals submitted for the Spring 2005 Competitive Process funding cycle.

All proposals were considered eligible for funding, and were subject to criteria ranking. There were \$3,487,109 in requests and only \$2,384,911 in available dollars. The funding results are as follows:
