



City Allocates Federal Funds for Affordable Housing and Community Development

On Tuesday, June 6, 2006 the Fort Collins City Council formally adopted the Fiscal Year 2006-2007 Funding Allocation for community development and affordable housing proposals submitted for the Spring 2006 Competitive Process funding cycle.

All proposals were considered eligible for funding, and were subject to criteria ranking. There were \$2,582,048 in requests and only \$2,141,535 in available dollars. The funding results are as follows:
