
How Crushing Benefits You

In 2009, City of Fort Collins' Crushing Operations recycled more than 100,000 metric tons of material. Crushing was recognized as a national best practice sustainability project for its reduction of water, solid waste, transportation pollution, and greenhouse gas. It also generates revenue.

To save water, the City offers recycling of toilets and rebates for WaterSense toilets. In 2009, water savings from toilet replacements were 43,989,000 gallons, the average water needed for 270 families. Residents or businesses replacing their toilets with a new low-flow toilet, can receive a \$50 rebate on your City of Fort Collins utility bill. For more information visit: *fcgov.com/conserve*.

Crushing also avoided 90,000 metric tons of greenhouse gas (GHG), more than the entire City operations generates. The manufacturing of concrete emits high amounts of GHG, so many cities require recycling of construction debris. The City of Fort Collins is doing its part to set a great concrete recycling example.

The program accepts materials that meet the following specifications. Please consider diverting any of these materials from the landfill and bring them to us. We reserve the right to decline loads. If you dump an unacceptable load, you will be charged a dump fee. We cannot take any type of material from building demolitions.

We will accept:

- Pit run (clean dirt and rock mixture)
- Asphalt (clean, broken, or milled asphalt)
- Concrete (no rebar or other contaminants)
- Dirt & soil

Which Product is Right for Me?

Recycled asphalt has good compaction, remains inert, and is virtually dust free.

Since crushed concrete compacts better than any other product, it is well worth the extra \$.50/ton. Crushed concrete is also lighter in weight, non-expansive, and has a moisture content of about 13%. The result is that concrete absorbs twice the amount of water before becoming saturated.
