Fats, Oils & Grease (F.O.G.) and are found in common foods and ingredients such as: bacon and other meats, fish, butter, cooking oil, mayonnaise, gravies, dressings and food scraps. Often, Fats, Oils and Grease become a liquid from cooking, or they may be hidden within products such as dressings, mayonnaise and other foods that were cooked in oil and/or butter.

F.O.G. builds up and creates havoc on the sewer back-ups in your home and

sewer system and pipes by causing clogs and neighborhood.

Often times Fats, Oils and Grease are in liquid form and appear to wash down a drain. Garbage disposals break up chunks of food, but do not get rid of F.O.G. Instead, F.O.G. solidifies and collects on walls of pipes until they become clogged.




Soak up remaining Fats, Oils and Grease with a paper towel and dispose with your food in a garbage can.


