## **Neighborhood Fall Checklist**

Rake and compost leaves regularly.
Start an outdoor compost pile for leaves.
Always blow or rake leaves into piles on your lawn or other grassy surfaces, never onto pavement.
Bag leaves before taking them to a drop-off site or place in a curbside container for recycling pickup by your trash service.
Prune trees and compost or mulch trimmings.
Mow the lawn one last time before winter. Keep grass to three inches or less.
Aerate so plants will absorb water and nutrients over winter months.
Fertilize your lawn in early fall - if you fertilize twice per year.
Use organic or slow-release fertilizers.
Store leftover fertilizer in containers with lids or in covered areas.
Take unwanted fertilizer and other lawn chemicals to household hazardous waste sites.
Mulch young plants before the first frost. This will keep loose soil near them from washing into storm drains, as winter snow melts.
Dry out sprinkler systems. Freezing underground sprinkler pipes can burst and cause leaking water to wash fertilizer, leaves and grass clippings into storm drains.
Empty rain barrels and seal them until spring.
