## Understanding Your Fort Collins Utilities Residential Net Metering Bill



1. Account information, including account number and service address.
2. Your current billing period total for all services and your overall total, including unpaid amounts from past billing periods.
3. Breakdown of previous and current balances. Total amount due includes past unpaid charges
4. The Usage listed on your bill is the amount of energy used or returned depending on time of day and season based on your Fort Collins Utilities meter.
5. TOD Elec Energy Net Meter shows all energy charges and credits for the month. Base charges are applied to all customers and are the same every month. Summer and Non-Summer charges are based on the amount of energy consumed during two time periods (on-peak and off-peak) throughout the day. There is also a tier charge for electric use over 700 kWh (except for all-electric heat homes).
6. The amount of solar electricity you returned to the grid in times of surplus/overgeneration is labeled RET. To determine the amount of solar energy used by your house for the service period, take the gross solar generation (kWh) from your system monitoring device for the corresponding service dates from your utility bill and subtract the RET amounts (kWh) on your bill (e.g., If your system monitoring device says $1,000 \mathrm{kWh}$ was produced for the service dates and your bill says 287 kWh was returned, your house consumed 713 kWh of solar energy).
To determine the total amount of energy used by your home, add solar energy used by your house (determined above) to the total kWh usage on bill (e.g., 713 kWh plus 750 kWh (sum of Non-Summer 2 Peak and Non-Summer 2 Off-Pk usage) equals $1,463 \mathrm{kWh}$ for the household).
